In everyday life this means birthdays are missed, first steps need to be recorded, and relationships need to be re-tuned with every departure and homecoming. It means that kids' schools are changed, and spouses' jobs are left behind. It means worry until the member is safely home.

Despite all this, military families are tremendously proud to serve and make their family situations work amidst the challenges. The MFRC provides members of Canadian Armed Forces families with the resources and support they need to meet these challenges and thrive.

BOARD AND STAFF



The Calgary MFRC supports a unique local military community who live in both urban and rural communities. Our members include a large number of:


Veterans

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS AND MILESTONES

Mental Health and Wellness Support

Family members who are dealing with a military member's illness, injury or death can work with a Family Liaison Officer for:

- Support navigating different programs and services
- Referrals to mental health services
- Access to education and prevention programs in the community
- Short term individual or group counselling support of families of ill, injured, or deceased members
- Tailored assistance to families of the fallen

Veteran Family Program

The MFRC supports medically releasing CAF members, medically releasing Veterans, and their families by helping them navigate:

- The complex process of releasing
- The challenges that may arise
- The impacts that can happen to social, emotional and financial well-being
- Access to community-based education and prevention programs, supports and services

Kids Summer Camps

Summer camps specifically for military and veteran youth are important because they provide a supportive and understanding environment that addresses the unique challenges these youth face. Calgary Military Family Resource Centre had 92 youth attend summer camps in 2023! We also facilitated 15 youth to attend Camp Maple Leaf.

Wellness Conference



Holistic Support for Well-Being

The 8 Dimensions of Wellness—emotional, physical, social, intellectual, occupational, financial, environmental, and spiritual—encompass all aspects of an individual's life.







Promoting Mental Health Awareness

Mental health is a critical aspect of overall wellness, and it can be particularly important in the military and veteran communities, where individuals may be at a higher risk for conditions such as PTSD, depression, and anxiety.

Strengthening Community Connections

The conference serves as a gathering point for military members, veterans, and their families to connect with one another and with wellness experts.

· Empowering Families with Knowledge and Skills

By educating attendees about the 8 Dimensions of Wellness, the conference equips military and veteran families with the knowledge and skills needed to take proactive steps toward their own well-being.

By hosting the wellness conference, the Calgary MFRC demonstrates its commitment to the well-being of military and veteran families. It sends a clear message that their health and happiness are a priority, and that they are not alone in their journey toward wellness.

Community Booths

These booths enabled us to connect with the military community and the greater community alike. We attended 33 Enrolment Ceremonies where we were able to speak to approximately 254 new enrollees and 762 family members.

Speaking directly with the members helps us get a better understanding of the programs and services that would make a meaningful impact in their lives. It is also a gentle reminder to members that we are here for them to offer assistance when needed.

FUNDING

The MFRC is primarily funded through three separate but equally important sources: the Base Commander; Military Family Services (MFS), and fund development.

Base Commander

For the 2023/24 fiscal year, approximately 6% of the annual operating budget came from the Base Commander. This funding is directed to site-specific and enhanced mandated services.

Military Family Services

For the 2023/24 fiscal year, approximately 59% of the annual operating budget came from Military Family Services (MFS) to provide the Military Family Services Program (MFSP) to Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) and Veteran families.

This funding is provided for mandated services set out in the annual funding application submitted to MFS. This process ensures that all military families may access similar programs of consistent quality at any MFRC.



Fund Development

For the 2023/234 fiscal year, approximately 19% of the annual operating budget came from funds raised through a variety of sources including donations, proceeds from the sale of yellow ribbon merchandise, and grants.
