As Co-Chairs we have enjoyed serving together and maintaining focus on our strategic priorities to remain strong, secure and engaged.



Our programs and services will continue to be offered at our CPAC location in Colwood. Families living throughout Esquimalt, Greater Victoria and beyond will now be able to receive services and support in this new Esquimalt location.



The Work Point MFRC will offer the following services:

- Reception, information & referral services, military family IDs, welcome services
- Counselling and support for all members of the family
- Workshops for all ages
- Community gatherings
- Creative Learning for the Early Years and Respite Child Care During Absences services
- Drop-in space (coffee/tea and seating area)
- An outdoor area for play and gatherings
- A kitchen for meals, workshops and use of the community
- This will be a fully accessible and inclusive building

We anticipate our Grand Opening in Summer of 2026!!

Information & Referral

- Interacted with 2,753 individuals and families at the front desk
- Top inquiries: morale mail (399), counselling access (135), and daycare (114)
- Introduced monthly evening hours to improve access to services and morale mail
- Issued 115 Military Family ID Cards
- Sent 236 welcome emails to incoming CAF members
- Volunteers contributed 1,262.5 hours across various program areas

Community Integration

- Engagement and growth in popular programs: Early Years Programs, Supporting Children Through Absence, Wellness Wednesdays, Fast Friends and English as a Second Language (ESL)
- Launched new initiatives: Community Kitchen Program and Coffee Connections
- Hosted the Dockyard Ghost Walk for 117 participants, with tours in English and French
- Maintained strong partnerships with Books for Breakfast, Work BC, The Conservatory of Music, and The Maritime Museum of British Columbia
- Formed new partnerships with Greater Victoria Public Library and Vancouver Island Regional Library, creating Absence & Relocation Literacy Kits for children

Deployment & Work-Related Absences

- Supported two ship departures and five homecomings
- Engaged with 268 families through virtual Pre-Deployment Briefs and 127 families via Monthly Information Sessions with deployed ship's Command Teams
- Created and sent 819 care packages to deployed members aboard HMCS Vancouver and HMCS Ottawa, based on contributions from friends and family members, including 250 stockings with donations from the Cowichan District Hospital

Community Engagement

- The team and volunteers hosted and joined 19 events, including ship departures, homecomings, Buccaneer Day Parade, McHappy Day, and the new Festive Family Pancake Breakfast
- Thanks to generous donations, we provided free tickets and ran contests for military families throughout the year

Housing Support Program

- The Housing Program continues to grow, strengthening ties with CAF members, landlords, and property managers across Greater Victoria
- A new Housing Portal, designed to streamline access to resources, launched in Summer 2025

Children's Services

- Delivered 123 Music & Me classes, benefiting 39 community children and 29 daycare children
- Helped 16 children prepare for Kindergarten through Big Steps for Kinder Prep
- Provided 1,833 hours of respite child care via Creative Learning for the Early Years
- Distributed 39 Welcome Baby Bags to families
- Facilitated the mailing of 2,138 books through the Dolly Parton Imagination Library program




