

Autumn General Mess Meeting

MINUTES

Sea Room, Juno Tower Thursday, November 23rd, 2023, 10:30 AST

- 1. Call to Order / Confirmation of Quorum
 - The PMC confirmed a quorum was present (approximately 65 Ordinary and 2 Associate Members in attendance) and called the meeting to order at 10:36.
- 2. Opening Remarks
 - The PMC welcomed everyone to the meeting and indicated that he likes to work by consensus. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask.
 - The proposed Senior Sub, Capt. Brandon Finyanos, was found hiding in the crowd and was cajoled to sit at the Committee Table where he rightly belongs.
- 3. Approval of Agenda
 - The PMC noted that the agenda had been previously circulated with the meeting invitation.
 - The PMC called for any additions, deletions, or amendments.
 - Hearing none, the PMC called for a **motion to approve the agenda** as circulated:

Motion passed.

- 4. Approval of previous Minutes: Annual General Meeting, 13 April 23.
 - The PMC noted that the AGM Minutes had been previously circulated with the meeting invitation.
 - The PMC called for any additions, deletions, or amendments.
 - Hearing none, the PMC called for a **motion to approve the previous minutes** as circulated:

The minutes were approved by consensus without dissent.

5. Introduction of Committee Members

• The PMC introduced the proposed new members of the Mess Committee and indicated that we are still looking for a Bull Sub.

There being no additional nominations or volunteers for the proposed positions, the Mess Committee was **approved by acclamation without dissent.**

6. Financial Report (Treasurer):

- The Treasurer presented the financial report (see ppt below). The figures for 30 Sept 23 were prepared internally. Our current unencumbered cash is approximately \$52,000. The Treasurer confirmed the HOM is anticipating a loss of approximately \$37,000. This is due to:
 - a. the delayed re-opening of RA Park impacting expected revenue;
 - b. the eight-week closure of the mess due to the HVAC/water break again, revenue;
 - c. the cancellation of six weddings due to HVAC/water break and mess closure; and
 - d. impacts from COVID.
- The Treasurer explained that we are funded for all our activities until the end of the fiscal year, but do not have excess funds for new initiatives.
- Question: Are we allowed to have corporate sponsors? Mess Manager, yes. This
 could be an option for New Years or other events.
- The PMC reinforced that our finances are healthy, but any rumours of excess cash are not true.
- The finances were **approved by consensus without dissent**.

7. Old Business and Business Arising

• RA Park Re-opening (VPMC):

RA Park has now re-opened but renovations of the facility are still ongoing. RP Ops has a number of small issues such as a kitchen exhaust fan and door lock that still require rectification by contractors. The staff have been working tirelessly to complete the process of re-opening (Thanks Tina!). The renovation has brought the building back to a state of around 1850, but while meeting 2023 building codes – such as fire suppression.

• The PMC highlighted that we will be scheduling both daytime and evening events to ensure that everyone is able to participate in mess activities.

8. Reports:

Membership Officer:

The Membership Officer, Lt(N) Anne-Marie Day, introduced herself and her role. She encouraged that the membership become involved in organizing activities and events – our mess is what we make it. She highlighted that the Membership Officer is here to represent your interests – please reach out if you have ideas, questions, or comments.

Question: Are we supposed to have an RA Park Rep, will we be creating a committee? VPMC, as the PMC of RA Park, I am your representative. We have only just re-opened and need to generate more Membership engagement on both the Mess Committee and Entertainment Committee.

Question: What is the difference between Associate and Honorary Members? A full description of both Associate and Honorary can be found in the Constitution and By-Laws – but the main difference is that Honorary Members do not pay Mess Dues. Neither Associate nor Honorary Members have voting rights.

Question: Can you confirm are Class A Reservists are entitled to a departure gift? IAW the By-Laws: For the purchase of a memento for each Ordinary Member departing on posting who has been a Member of the Mess for at least 24 months. Posting gifts will consist of a range of products approved from time to time by the Mess Committee. These gifts will generally be available in the mess office, and may include prints, mugs, books, or plaques, etcetera.

Question: How do we claim our baby, departure, or other gifts? Please speak to the Membership Officer, Lt(N) Anne-Marie Day.

 Entertainment Officer (PMC on behalf of SLt Jason Pereira)
 The PMC highlighted that we are looking for units to take ownership of Superweepers as hosts. Please speak to any member of the Committee if you are interested.

There was a review of upcoming events (see ppt below).

The PMC indicated that we are looking to encourage a bit of a rivalry between the messes to encourage fun.

Question: How will events be allocated to Juno vs RA Park? PMC, with RA Park returning to operations, we will alternate locations for events.

The Mess Secretary highlighted that members are encouraged to volunteer as OPIs for events. It is a great way to get involved in the mess, learn how to be a

host, and differentiate yourself. Mentorship and guidance are available. If you are interested, please reach out to the Entertainment Officer, SLt Jason Pereira.

Question: Will the OPI to an event get a free ticket to the event that they organize? The PMC recommended a motion be made.

Capt. McLean made a motion that the OPI to an event get a free ticket for themselves and a plus one for the event that they organize:

Passed without dissent.

VPMC

The VPMC, LCol Andrew Nicholson, reinforced that RA Park is still in the process of opening. We are seeking members for the Entertainment Committee to help with planning, and we need to be patient as we build capacity. We have a limited staff that we are looking to hire more.

If you have a great idea for an event, please let us know, we would like to support your vision. Just please manage expectations with the knowledge that we are still getting up and running.

PMC

The PMC, Cdr Bill Sanson, highlighted that we are looking for ways to improve our communication including sending invites via outlook.

We are trending upward with member engagement and it's great to see our community participation grow. Thank you to everyone for their work to get us here post-COVID. We are looking for OPIs and Hosts for events. We want to be conducting events at both messes and promoting engagement with all of our members.

Please remember the Golden Rule – treat everyone as you want to be treated.

If there are issues, please reach out to the PMC for resolution.

We are looking for more engagement with the Mess Committee, especially the Entertainment Committee. This is our mess, and it functions best when we are involved.

He also highlighted the importance of appropriate dress. The mess is attended by senior officers as well as foreign officers, and we want to reflect positively on ourselves. Please consider that PT strip is not appropriate.

Finally, we are looking for ways to improve the décor of the space by engaging with the Naval Museum and other sources for art/historical items.

The PMC, pointed out that this draw is because we are no longer able to open the PMC chit following the General Meetings while the chit system is reviewed at the national level.


