Welcome to 15 Wing Moose Jaw! 15 Wing, headquartered in Moose Jaw, is the centre of RCAF aircrew training and is comprised of 2 Canadian Forces Flying Training School (CFFTS) and 431 Air Demonstration Squadron (CF Snowbirds) both located in Moose Jaw, SK, and 3 CFFTS located in Portage la Prairie, MB. The Wing is the principal site of the NATO Flying Training in Canada (NFTC) and Contracted Flight Training and Support (CFTS) programs.

15 Wing is responsible for seven different aircraft platforms that include: CT-156 Harvard II, CT-155 Hawk, CT-114 Tutor, CH-139 Jet Ranger, Bell 412 CF, Grob 120A and C90B King Air.

About Saskatchewan

- Saskatchewan is Canada's "sunniest" province, averaging from 2000 to 2500 hours of sunshine annually.
- Saskatchewan is on Central Standard Time year round. This means that we never change our clocks.
- The provincial tax rate in Saskatchewan is 6%.
- The name Saskatchewan derives from the Plains Indian word "kisiskatchewan" which means swiftly flowing river. More than half of Saskatchewan is covered by forest.

Vehicle Information

Saskatchewan Vehicle Registration

Saskatchewan operates a mandatory vehicle registration and insurance program. When a vehicle owner purchases licence plates, they also purchase a basic package of insurance, which includes coverage for damage to their own vehicle subject to a \$700 deductible. Check out www.sgi.sk.ca for more info.

Saskatchewan Driver's Licence

New residents wishing to drive in Saskatchewan must obtain a Saskatchewan driver's licence within 90 days of moving to the province, or upon expiry of their out-of-province licence — whichever comes first. Check with your previous jurisdiction as they may have some restrictions that supersede this requirement.

Saskatchewan Government Insurance (SGI) is the principal vehicle insurer in Saskatchewan. All vehicles previously licensed in another jurisdiction must pass a mandatory vehicle inspection. Please see www.sgi.sk.ca for more info.

SGI services are located at 105 4th Avenue N.W. For more information regarding hours of operation etc., please contact them directly at 1-844-855-2744.



Traffic Laws

Please be aware that each province has different restrictions and traffic laws. For example, radar-detecting systems are permitted in some provinces (such as Saskatchewan), but not in others. As well, Saskatchewan has restrictions regarding non-factory tinted windows on your vehicles. Please see www.iwfa.com for clarification. Should you have any questions or concerns regarding vehicle restrictions and traffic laws, please contact your provincial police department.

Calian Military Family Doctor Network

Calian Health, in partnership with Military Family Services (MFS), offers the Calian Military Family Doctor Network as part of its corporate citizenship efforts. The goals of the program are to improve access to quality health care for Canadian Armed Forces families by expediting the process of obtaining a physician and reducing the number of military spouses and children without a family physician.

The program, which is provided at no cost to families, Military Family Services or the Canadian Armed Forces, is now available in Moose Jaw. Calian staff have also started to extend their reach and appeal to family physicians who are not practicing at Primacy Clinics to make room in their practices for military family members.

Who is eligible for the program?

Canadian military families who are not eligible for medical services from the Department of National Defence and live in one of the participating locations.

How Do I Sign Up for the Program?

What should I expect?

A representative from Calian's Primacy team will contact you to review your application.

Note: All family child care homes, licensed or unlicensed, are permitted to care for up to 8 children including the provider's own children under 10 years of age.

- Up to 5 of the 8 children may be infants, toddlers, and preschoolers; and
- Only 2 of the 5 children may be infants or toddlers (under 30 months); or
- There can be 3 infants or toddlers if all the other children are school aged.

Group Family Child Care Homes must be licensed by Early Years Branch and are permitted, with an assistant, to care for up to 12 children including the provider's own children under 10 years of age.

All facilities licensed by Ministry of Education, Early Years Branch will have a Ministry of Education licence posted. Family Child Care Homes will also have a family child care home sign posted in a window.

If you require licensed daycare, please be proactive in securing a waitlist spot in advance with either the Moose Jaw School Boards and /or the YMCA. (https://www.prairiesouth.ca/parents/early-learning/) Should any of the above organizations require you to provide a local physical address, please feel free to use the following: 80 Nato Drive, Bushell Park, SK, SOH ONO

Board of Directors

The Board of Directors is the legal authority for the MFRC and is responsible to the military community. As a member of this volunteer Board, a Director is a trustee for the community and is responsible for the effective governance of the organization. Members of the Board provide guidance, support and direction to the Executive Director to set overall policy and establish the long-term goals of the MFRC.

The Board of Directors is comprised of 51% military spouses, and the balance is to be from the military and civilian community. In addition, several ex-officio positions (non-voting) are appointed for their expertise. Volunteers who wish to be part of the Board of Directors just need to have an interest in the work of the MFRC and be willing to participate in monthly meetings to discuss current and ongoing issues relating to the MFRC.



The Moose Jaw MFRC operates an Early Learning Centre offering casual child care, Monday to Friday.



ELC Rates (as of Oct 2023):

Military/Associate Members:

Infants ages 0-18 months: \$15.00 per 3 hour block

Children ages 18 months and over: \$12.00 per 3 hour block *\$6.00 per additional child in the same family, regardless of age.







Family Care Plan

A Family Care Plan is a mandatory Department of National Defence form that prepares families of Canadian Armed Forces members to be taken care of in case of unforeseen events, emergency callouts and planned deployment. By identifying primary and secondary caregivers who should be contacted in the event of an emergency or military tasking, your Family Care Plan supports your family in your absence.

Essentially, the Family Care Plan is a regularly updated exchange of information between your family and a Commanding Officer. A completed Family Care Plan is designed to support individual and unit operational readiness.

All Canadian Armed Forces personnel must complete the Family Care Plan (FCP) Declaration DND Form 2886. It isn't a legally binding document, but it is kept on the military member's file. Family Care Plans are protected under the Privacy Act.

For a copy of the "Form DND 2886, Family Care Plan (FCP) Declaration", please contact your orderly room.

Emergency Child Care

In times of crisis, normal levels of support may not be enough. As part of the Emergency Family Care

Assistance (EFCA) Policy, Canadian Forces Morale and Welfare Services can provide military families

with financial assistance to help offset costs associated with care of a family member.

Depending on the situation, you may need to cover the cost of services up front but you will be

reimbursed. Reimbursements will be issued by either Military Family Services or the MFRC, but not by

both. There is no cost to military families for using these services.



Child Care Support

Single parenting for long periods of time can be a little overwhelming and sometimes a break might be necessary. When the CAF member is away, families can access a variety of services. All families experiencing an absence due to training or a deployment qualify for these programs.

Early Learning Centre (ELC) Program

Families of deployed members are eligible to receive a *3 hour block of free child care per week* at the ELC (ages 0 to kindergarten) in addition to a *3 hour block of half price child care per week*. Please call 306-694-2222 ext. 5318 to book your child in at the ELC and let the staff know that you would like to use the respite discount.

Stay and Play Saturday

This respite child care program is offered one Saturday a month at the ELC. The program is free for children of deployed CAF members. Pre-registration is required by calling the ELC at 306-694-2222 ext. 5318.

Family Information Line



The Family Liaison Officer (FLO) is part of your local CAF Transition Centre. The FLO connects the two centres to ensure the widest variety of support is offered to military personnel and their families. The FLO provides a variety of free support including:

- Confidential individual and family counselling covering a wide range of areas trauma; addictions; relationship matters; parental child conflict; adapting to change; personal growth; grief & loss; work-life balance.
- Referrals to mental health services for adults and children and community based programs
- Access to educational and preventative-based programs
- Outreach support to families within Saskatchewan
- Crisis Support
- Assistance in applying for emergency funding
- Support for caregivers and families coping with injuries, illness and loss (such as Operational Stress Injuries)
- Support to families of medically releasing CAF personnel
- Support to families of deceased CAF personnel

Strongest Families

Is your child or youth between the ages of 3-17? Are they experiencing behaviour issues or anxiety? Strongest Families Institute is a not-for-profit corporation providing evidence-based services to children and families seeking help for mental health and other issues impacting health and well-being. They provide timely care to families by teaching skills through their unique distance coaching approach — supporting families over the phone and internet in the comfort and privacy of their own home. Strongest Families provides family-centered care that is customized to their needs.



They can help with feelings like anxiety or anger that may arise due to the challenges of military life, particularly during deployment and training separations.

Examples of previous and future programming:


- Wellness workshops for the whole family (anxiety, self-esteem, grief and loss)

The Veteran Family Program

The Veteran Family Program (VFP) is a joint initiative between Veterans Affairs Canada and Military Family Services. The VFP is a bilingual service that provides support to medically-released Veterans and their families to effectively prepare for and transition to civilian life.

Services



Mental Health First Aid Course - an evidenced-based course that teaches participants to identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental illness and substance abuse disorders.

Care for the Caregiver - an online course which provides information about Operational Stress Injuries (OSI) as well as self-care tools to support individuals who are in a caregiver role to someone living with an OSI.





C.O.P.E - a group-based, psycho-educational and counselling program for veterans of the CAF and their spouse/partner who are struggling with the effects of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).

SISIP Financial Workshops - financial briefings to assist VFP audiences with their financial matters as they approach release and transition out of the CAF.

Family Information Line - trained <u>Family Information Line</u> counsellors offer confidential, bilingual information, referral and crisis support 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and can help connect serving members, released Veterans and their families to resources. The Veteran Family Journal - The Veteran Family Journal is a tool designed to assist medically releasing CAF members, medically released Veterans and their families in making a successful transition from military to civilian life. The Journal is unique to each family as it serves as a source of information and a reference for materials you can rely on as you transition from CAF member to Veteran status.





Caregiver Zone - developed by Veterans Affairs Canada, the <u>Caregiver Zone</u> features a suite of tools available to the caregiver, including a library, a community of sharing, caregiver coach support, and a list of services and resources.
