

OUTCAN Guide | Life in Bangladesh

LOCATION

- **Country**: Bangladesh
- **City**: Dhaka (capital)
- Base: Embassy Posting
- Mission Acronym: DHAKA

OTHER INFO TO CONSIDER

- **Residency Registration**: Foreigners must register with the Department of Immigration and Passports within 90 days of arrival.
- **Visa Requirements**: Canadians require a visa to enter Bangladesh. For stays longer than the visa period, an extension must be applied for.

POPULATION

- Size: Approximately 21 million people in Dhaka
- Ethnicity: Predominantly Bengali

LANGUAGE(S)

- Official Language: Bengali (Bangla)
- **Local Languages**: English is widely used in government, business, and education.

COST OF LIVING

- **Currency**: Bangladeshi Taka (BDT)
- Exchange Rate: 1 CAD = 65 BDT (July 2024)

QUALITY OF LIFE

- **Climate**: Tropical monsoon climate:
 - **Dhaka**: Hot, humid summers (up to 40°C or 104°F), mild winters (down to 10°C or 50°F), monsoon rains from June to October.
- Natural Disasters: Prone to cyclones, flooding, and occasional earthquakes.

LAWS AND CULTURE

- **Drug Laws**: Severe penalties for possession, use, or trafficking of illegal drugs.
- **Alcohol**: Legal drinking age is 21. Alcohol is available in licensed bars and restaurants but is generally limited due to cultural and religious norms.
- Driving: The legal blood alcohol limit is 0.00%. Strict penalties for drinking and driving.
- **Cultural Influence**: Predominantly Muslim country, with significant Hindu, Christian, and Buddhist minorities. Respect for local customs and dress codes is important.

SAFETY AND SECURITY

- **Driving**: An international driving permit is required. Driving conditions can be challenging due to traffic and road conditions.
- **Crime**: Petty crime like theft and pickpocketing is common. Exercise caution, especially in crowded areas.

HOUSING

- **Support**: Embassy postings. Families are allocated a place based on the local housing committee's recommendation.
- **Availability**: A range of housing options including apartments and houses with varying levels of Western amenities

EMPLOYMENT

- **Spousal Employment**: Limited opportunities. Employment in the local economy may be subject to local regulations and taxes.
- **Op Tempo**: Varies depending on position. Travel within the region may be required.

HEALTH CARE

- Access: Medical care varies by region. In major cities, modern hospitals and private clinics are available.
- Language: English-speaking doctors and staff are common in major cities.
- **Special Needs**: Services may be limited. Consultation with medical officers is recommended.
- **Pregnancy and Birth**: Comprehensive care is available in private hospitals.
- **Dental**: Private dental care is widely available. Upfront payment is required, with reimbursement through health insurance.
- While OUTCAN, families of Canadian Armed Forces members are enrolled in comprehensive medical coverage through the <u>Public Service Health Care Plan</u>, which is administered by <u>MSH International</u>. Families are covered for dental care through the <u>Public Service Dental Care Plan</u> by <u>Canada Life</u>. Look for places that direct bill to your insurance where possible.

SCHOOLING

- **Schools**: Several international schools are available in major cities, offering various curricula such as IB, British, and American systems.
 - Examples:
 - American International School Dhaka
 - International School Dhaka
 - Scholastica
- **Special Needs**: Services may be limited. Consultation with schools and education management is advised.
- Consult with <u>CEM</u> and schools prior to any commitments.

CHILDCARE

• **Availability**: High-quality childcare services, including daycare and preschool programs, are available in major cities. English-speaking staff are common.

TRANSPORTATION

- **Airport**: Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport (DAC) in Dhaka.
- **Public Transport**: Public transportation includes buses, rickshaws, and taxis. Ride-sharing services like Uber and Pathao are widely used.
- **Driving**: An international driving permit is required for driving in Bangladesh.

- Military Family Services: No specific center in Bangladesh, but remote support is available through the global MFS team: globalmfs-sfmmondiaux@cfmws.com
- **Mental Health Resources**: Limited services. Consultation with embassy or consular services recommended.

- Internet: Quality of internet service varies by region, with major cities having reliable service.

ACTIVITIES

Historical Sites

- Lalbagh Fort: 17th-century Mughal fort complex in Dhaka, a popular tourist attraction.
- **Ahsan Manzil**: Historical pink palace and museum located on the banks of the Buriganga River in Dhaka.
- **Sixty Dome Mosque**: UNESCO World Heritage Site located in Bagerhat, known for its impressive architecture.

Nature and Outdoor Activities

- **Sundarbans**: Largest mangrove forest in the world, home to the Bengal tiger and a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- **Cox's Bazar**: World's longest natural sea beach, a popular destination for relaxation and water activities.
- **Srimangal**: Known as the tea capital of Bangladesh, offering lush green tea gardens and scenic beauty.

Cultural Experiences

- Dhaka Art Summit: Biennial event showcasing contemporary art from South Asia and beyond.
- **Bangladesh National Museum**: Located in Dhaka, it offers a comprehensive overview of the country's history, culture, and art.
- **Traditional Festivals**: Experience vibrant festivals like Pohela Boishakh (Bengali New Year) and Durga Puja.

Modern Attractions

- **Bashundhara City**: One of the largest shopping malls in South Asia, located in Dhaka.
- Jamuna Future Park: A large shopping and entertainment complex in Dhaka, offering a variety of shops and activities.
- Gulshan Lake Park: Popular urban park in Dhaka for leisure and outdoor activities.

Markets and Shopping

- **New Market**: One of the oldest and busiest shopping areas in Dhaka, offering a wide range of goods.
- Dhaka College Market: Known for affordable clothing and accessories.
- **Chawk Bazaar**: Famous for traditional foods and iftar items during Ramadan.

RESTRICTIONS TO CONSIDER

- Common Law Relationships: Not legally recognized.
- Same-Sex Couples: Not legally recognized and can face social and legal challenges.
- **Medications**: Prescription medications are regulated. Narcotics and certain pain medications are controlled substances.
