BGen Quinn indicated the meeting is a follow-up to the meeting held 5 May regarding the first half of the Summer Chalet program. There are three important decisions to be made regarding: the second half of the Summer Chalet program, the Winter Chalet program and Store operations.	Info

	1. The Chair asked the Committee members to review the previous record of decisions, from the meeting held on 17 April 2020, for errors or omissions.

III	REVIEW OF FINANCIAL END OF YEAR 2019-2020	
īV	 The Sr Mgr PSP (E) presented the EF financials at end of FY 2019-2020. A financial statement was not provided due to the lack of sales within the EF stores. EF completed 2019-20 with net income of €66,667 vice net income budgeted of €5911. The outcome was better than expected due to: a. Profit sharing higher by €18K; b. CANEX SISIP higher by €12.5K; c. Expenses Rep Fund lower by €12,2K; and d. EF grant not used by €11,8K. EF finished the year in a healthy financial position with an unencumbered cash balance of €141,434K. 	1. The EFWG Chair informed that the EFWG discussed the second	
	half of the Summer Chalet and Winter Chalet program. The	
	recommendations were done before and after lifting of travel	
	restrictions in mind.

- EF is committed to the Chalet season financially if the borders are opened.
- c. Key Facts/Deductions
 - Two chalets are already paid for ½ season:
 - a. Normandy, France: 4 weeks worth €3440;
 - b. Trojir, Croatia: 9 weeks worth €3930
 - ii. EF finished the FY 2019-2020 in a healthy financial position with €141,4K;
 - iii. Plan to ensure chalets are disinfected after each use liaise with the owners; and
 - iv. Chalet program is insured by CIP (liability).
- d. Two COAs developed:
 - i. COA 1 Continue the season as of 1 Aug
 - ii. COA 2 Cancel the remainder of the season 1
 Aug 2020 to Oct 2020 and replace it by Full Flex
 (similar to the first half of the summer program).
- e. EFWG recommendation is COA 2, to cancel the remainder of the summer season and provide Full Flex.
- 4. Discussion was held on the two COA options and on the possibility of an option of hybrid COA, with the following diverse points raised:
 - General feeling is that there is a lot of uncertainty, possible 2nd wave of the Covid-19, love the Chalet program, but preference for Full Flex this year;
 - b. There is a want to travel and keep the chalets;
 - c. Give a chance to the members to choose between a chalet and a Full Flex:
 - d. Look at a hybrid COA and whether the winner can deal directly with the chalet owners; and
 - e. If we continue with the chalet program, for those members who are unable/unwilling to take the chalet, we can go to another draw, however we will need to be clear on our communication.
- 5. NUF Representative motioned to continue the Summer Chalet season as of 1 August 2020 (COA 1), seconded by SCO CDLS (L)

Vote on COA 1: 5 in favour, 4 against

Motion carried.

6. Discussion: To ensure the program is clear, the following points were recorded. The chalet draw winners are responsible for the payment of the chalet. If unable to use the chalet a re-draw can happen. The PSP Chalet Coord will do the draw. If there is not a successful re-draw the original winner is still responsible for payment. Participants can only be those who are members of EF. There is

coverage for those not able or uncomfortable with travelling due to pandemic.

For those chalet winners of the remainder of the summer program, there is no full flex in lieu.

 - b. Austria, (North West);
 - c. France, Chamonix;
 - d. Crete, Greek Island:
 - e. Portugal, Madeira Island; and
 - f. Germany, Garmish-Partenkirchen.
- 8. At this time, European countries are open for travel from the EU. Note: The above information comes from the JAG tool which may not be accurate for CAF travelling with Canadian passports and SOFA stamps and thus members should verify prior to booking.
 - a. Assumptions:
 - i. Borders are open in Europe; and
 - ii. No CAF travel restrictions within Europe.
 - b. Limitations:
 - i. Limited revenues; and
 - ii. Unknown timeline for a possible second wave of Covid-19
 - c. Key Facts/Deductions
 - No contract signed yet, but chalet owners are aware of this meeting and awaiting quick decision. Draw is scheduled for mid-Sep, so contracts must be signed soon;
 - ii. EF has credited weeks in April 2021
 - a. Austria: 1 week worth €1100;
 - b. Crete: 6 weeks' worth €5040;
 - c. Madera: 3 weeks' worth €1320, and
 - d. Spain: 2 weeks' worth €2500
 - iii. EF finished FY 2019-2020 in a healthy financial position with €141K; and
 - iv. Plan to ensure chalets are disinfected after each use;
 - v. Rules for the chalet programs can be amended to suit the chosen COA.
 - d. Four COAs were developed:
 - i. COA 1 Status Quo

11. With all EFWG COAs rejected, the Chair opened it up to other COA ideas. Various concerns and options were discussed, including discussion on adding a clause to the contract with owners for coverage of pandemic travel restrictions. Sr PSP Mgr (E) to discuss with CF Legal Advisor and amend the NPP contract accordingly. Chair took an informal poll regarding those in favour of having chalets this winter. The committee was in favour of having some kind of program with chalets for this winter. Therefore discussion continued on how much the Committee was willing to pay for a program and, in this spirit, the European fund budget was discussed regarding the amount to keep as the minimum baseline in the bank.

- 12. Two important conclusions were reached:
 - a. To continue with some form of the winter chalet program; and
 - b. Keep a minimum of €60,0 K in the bank
- 13. EFWG to develop COAs based on above para and send EFC members a secretarial vote.

Note: the vote was received before the publication of the ROD. Members voted in favour of keeping all chalets and half of the Full Flex for the winter chalet season 2020-2021

STORE OPERATIONS

- 14. The Sr Mgr PSP(E) presented and explained the slides on the stores operations.
 - a. Assumptions:
 - All stores are opened 1 July (Ramstein opened 22 June and UK may open 6 July);
 - ii. Almost no sales from April to June;
 - iii. July: sales down 20% from budgeted;
