Golf Canada rules apply at all times with the exception of the following permanent local rules:

Out of bounds

A ball coming to rest on or beyond the road on holes 7, 8, 10, 11 and 18 is out of bounds, even if it rests on another part of the course which is in play for the other holes.

Hole 1 fence

The fence to the left of the fairway determines the out-of-bounds area. No clearance is allowed.

Growing shrubs and trees, pipes, fences and shelters

Young trees identified by yellow ribbons or wire mesh or stakes are forbidden play areas. If such a tree interferes with the ball's position, the player's position or his swing, the player must clear without penalty (as per rule 16.1f). Pole fences on holes 1, 9 and 18 are abnormal ground conditions and must be cleared without penalty (as per rule 16.1b). The same applies to the surrounding stones.

PI AYFR.

Power line

If it is certain or almost certain that a player's ball has hit an electric wire or a cable supporting an electric line during the play of holes 1, 10 and 11, the shot does not count. The player must play a ball, without a penalty stroke, from the place from which the previous shot was taken.

Poles

Electric poles are part of the game. The ball must be played where it rests.


