Treasurer's Report - Balance



- Unencumbered Balance: \$182K (to end-Dec)
 - +14K not yet in PSP system
 - Growing every year until 2023
 - Intend to benefit membership → Capital expenses and maintenance
- Capital expenses (via CER) will be added to the final budget
- Intent is to maintain balance between \$75K and \$100K

Division Report: Rear Commodore



- Clubhouse use:

- Clubhouse status/issues
 - Beautiful new awning system installed for \$3k below budget wholesale-direct supply from the manufacturer in Ontario (Local vendors quoted \$6k more)
 - Both dishwashers replaced by high-end Bosch models quiet and working well!
 - All-new commercial-grade patio chairs and tables bought and delivered
 - New large bar fridge bought & installed, old unit & stand sold for \$800
 - Upon side-door replacement project, found Carpenter Ant issue remediated this Spring
- Square Payment System
 - · Procured, being installed and trialed
 - FOC: 1 April 24
- Bar Ice Machine to be procured upon approvals
- No fee for event use (member/military); \$100 Damage Deposit


Division Report: Foreshore Officer



- Currently 27 vessels on docks
- Implement Marine Liability Insurance requirement
- Additional inspection requirement to be in force this year
 - Pleasure Craft Courtesy Inspection approved at AGM 23 and in ByLaws
 - Standard among Yacht Clubs in BC
 - Inspection available for free from RCM-SAR, RCMP, CPS
 - Mass Inspection for vessels Sept-Oct
- Update to Berthage application process during 2024



Division Report: Training Officer



- Basic Cruising Course
 - 1 April to mid-June
 - 24 Students (30 possible if 3 vessels)
- Advanced Course / Tech Nights
 - "Beyond the Bay" anchoring, weather, charts, planning
 - Free, non-certified 'course'

Division Report: Dinghy

- 26 Dinghy members; 10 new personnel trained in 2023.
- Purchased two new Club 420s in 2019
 - 2 boats on docks
 - 2 older hulls on land for rigging training
- Purchased two new covers (winter/summer) not ideal, looking for alternate solution
- Recapitalization of lines and sheets this spring
- Currently providing rigging 'how-to' and basic familiarization
- Plan to provide more formal instruction
- Desire to participate in fun races with CBSC



Division Report: Paddlesports



- Kayaks: now (planned)
 - 16 (12) Singles
 - 2 (1) touring doubles
 - 1 (0) 'play double'
 - 1 (1) Day trip double
- SUPs:
 - 3 (3) solid
 - 7 (7) inflatable
- Canoes: 2 (2)
- Accessories recapitalize, PFDs, throw bags ...
- Dispose of surplus kayaks, old PFDs
- Purchase Lightweight Single Kayak and Surfski
- Maintenance trailer deck/box, SUP rack in container

Strategic Plan

- Survey Volunteer (2023):
 - 26 responses
 - Support for minimum volunteer expectation
 - "I'm interested but don't know what is needed" was a theme
 - Perks for volunteering, no penalties for not volunteering

Constitution: Article III - Purpose



The primary purpose of the Club is to **promote recreational and organized sailing and kayaking opportunities** for serving and former members and their families, consistent with applicable regulations and orders. Specific objectives include, but are not limited to, provision of:

- a. Sail Canada (formally Canadian Yachting Association) and/or International Power and Sail Association (ISPA) and Transport Canada approved training in sailing, kayaking, seamanship, and pilotage, with an emphasis on water safety;
- b. Organized sailing activities including participation in CISM and Sail Canada sponsored regattas, locally sponsored races, cruising and adventure training under sail;
- c. Organized kayaking activities and adventure training;
- d. Safe facilities, recreational sailing, and other boating activities;
- e. Liaison between Club members and other CAF sailing clubs, boating organizations or sailing associations in Canada, the Commonwealth and elsewhere;
- f. A library of sailing and nautical information including books, charts, etc., and
- g. A Club Business Plan which forms the basis for realistic and sustainable Club growth.

- Ensure Paddlesports equipment supports member interests

Berthage Changes



- Current berthage application favours long-time, retired members who have time to contribute at their leisure (not serving members with jobs and young families)
- Currently all applications can be accommodated may not be the case in future
- Want to avoid making it an annual 'competition' if you're on the dock, you get to stay as long as ...?
- Refer jointly to ByLaws Committee and Foreshore Committee
- Propose amended approach for Membership Vote via Extraordinary General Meeting (Summer 2024)

- Proposed wording distributed and posted in Feb 24
- 4 x Constitution amendment; 13 x By-Laws amendment
- Plus minor wording changes of no substantive impact in both documents

Constitution:

- 1. Para 14 members that reside have a primary residence within...
- 2. Para 22 wording regarding monthly Exec meetings
- 3. Para 25 Quorum for AGM to be 33% 25% of membership.
- 4. Para 35 update of CFMWS harassment policy





By-Laws:

- Para 11 d/e/f remove Newsletter editor and Points Representative positions
 - Comms O can have an appointed assistant IAW para 11
 - Points Representative can be automated or not required
- 2. Para 11 establish Cruise Captain (appointed) position
 - Responsible for planning and organization of keelboat activities and events (cruises)
- Para 12 a Foreshore Committee to include Foreshore O, Vice Commodore, and Points Representative one other member endorsed by the Commodore



By-Laws (cont'd)

- 4. Para 15 b update of financial authorities:
 - i. Commodore: not exceeding \$1000 \$2000.
 - ii. Executive Committee: not exceeding \$1000 \$5000
 - iii. Membership (AGM Approval): exceeding \$2000 \$5000
 - iv. The Executive Committee, in consultation with the FS&R Director or his/her delegate, may authorize exceptional recurring and non-recurring expenditures of both a capital and non-capital nature greater than \$2000-\$5000 and not exceeding \$5000-\$10,000 for any one item or project only when the expenditure is deemed urgent and essential by said Committee, to the continuation of the club activities or preservation of assets.
- 5. Para 15 c CERs in excess of \$15,000 must be submitted to endorsed by the Executive Committee in writing and with detailed substantiation at least 90 30 days prior to an AGM...



By-Laws (cont'd)

- 6. Para 21 Security/Key Control add text on access via Keycode
- 7. Para 22 Facility users to provide a \$100 deposit, to be refunded on confirmation by Rear Commodore or his delegate (via Square)
- 8. Para 26 clarification regarding signature of waivers
- 9. Para 41 b A copy of ... \$2M Marine Liability Insurance (including a pollution clause) shall accompany all berth requests...
- 10. Para 41 c no longer restrict vessels over 40' (delete sentence)
- 11. Para 42 minor wording on how points are provided to Foreshore
- 12. Para 57 b and c amend sail plan process to remove Commissionaire and allow electronic transmission.
- 13. Removed Annex A Keelboat Rental Policy from ByLaws will be a standalone document available on Website.
