

OUTCAN Info Sheet 2020

Warsaw, Poland

LOCATION

Country: Poland Town: Warsaw

Entry/Exit requirements: Blue; Red, Green Passport, NATO Travel orders (NTO). SOFA Stamp in Passport.

Other info to Consider:

- Embassy Posting
- Foreigners must register their stay in Poland within 48 hours of arrival if the stay is to exceed 14 days
- To stay longer than 90 days, Canadians must apply either for a Polish visa in Canada before arriving in Poland or for
 a temporary residence permit while in Poland and must have a valid reason for extending their stay, such as
 education or employment.
- Family (non-dependants) can visit and stay 90 days without visa (Schengen Area).

POPULATION

Size: 1.78 million people within the city, 3.1 million in the greater metropolitan area.

Ethnicity: over 97% Polish

LANGUAGE(S)

Official language: Polish

Prevalence of French or English speaking: Very limited. Some establishments will have an English-speaking employee; however, English is not spoken freely and commonly. Limited to no French.

COST OF LIVING

Exchange rate to consider: Polish Zloty (PLN). 1 CDN=2,9PLN (Nov 2020)

QUALITY OF LIFE

Climate and potential for severe weather, natural disasters:

The climate is moderately continental, characterized by cold winters, with temperatures often below freezing (0 °C or 32 °F), and mild or pleasantly warm summers. Sometimes, cold waves from Siberia can occur, and the temperatures can drop to -20 °C (-4 °F) or below.

Laws and Culture:

- Penalties for possession, use or trafficking of illegal drugs are severe. Convicted offenders can expect lengthy jail sentences.
- It is illegal to consume alcohol in public places. If you are found intoxicated in a public area, you may be detained
 and could be taken to a sobering-up centre, where you may need to spend the night. You will be responsible for
 paying the cost of the stay.
- Penalties for drinking and driving are severe. The legal blood alcohol limit is 0.02 percent. Convicted offenders can expect heavy fines and jail sentences.
- If local authorities consider you a citizen of Poland, they may refuse you access to Canadian consular services.
- Riding a bike under the influence of alcohol is illegal and subject to detention and fines.

Safety and Security:

• You must carry an international driving permit. It must be obtained prior to arrival in Poland.

- Penalties for drinking and driving are severe. The legal blood alcohol limit is 0.02 percent. Convicted offenders can expect heavy fines and jail sentences.
- Foreigners may be required to pay traffic violation fines on the spot.
- Confrontations, which at times become violent, may occur between opposing fans at soccer matches. Exercise caution if attending a soccer match or if staying in the vicinity of sporting venues.

Level of isolation:

- There are two Canadian families posted to this location.
- May feel very isolated due to language barrier.

HOUSING

The Canadian Embassy will be supporting/assigning all housing needs.

EMPLOYMENT

Are there employment opportunities for spouses? Due to tax and legal implications, spousal employment on the economy is not a realistic option.

- Limited, language barrier.
- There are very limited employment opportunities available through CFMWS, so families should plan to be single income for the duration of the posting.

Op Tempo: The op tempo will vary greatly depending on position. TD is possible.

HEALTH CARE

Access: Satisfactory medical care is available in Poland.

- Highly accessible via private clinic (almost no wait times), public access very similar to Canada, incl. wait times.
- English services are available, French is very limited.
- All bills associated with the care of dependents are the member's personal responsibility and are to be claimed through PSHCP.

Special needs:

- Depending on language required (English/French), area of specialization and degree of support needed.
- It may be a wait before finding an appropriate match and at times may not be possible based on availability of English/French speaking providers or resources.
- It is highly advised that the family consult with Medical Screening Officer in Canada and / or the Canadian Element to ensure that the required services are readily available in either English or French before accepting a posting.

Consideration for pregnancy / birth: Health care for pregnancy and birth is available on the economy, private care.

Dental: Dental care can be accessed in town. You are required to pay up front, and you can then claim your expenses.

SCHOOLING

- Schooling is typically at the American School of Warsaw (IB) for grades JK-12, The British School, Warsaw (IB) for grades JK-8, and Lycée Français de Varsovie for grades JK-12.
- British curriculum is only deemed compatible up to gr 8; access to British curriculum beyond gr 8 requires WG B approval.

Curriculum vs. Canadian curriculum:

- The curriculum varies depending on choice of school.
- None of them offers Canadian history or geography at the elementary level.

Resources for special need children:

- Access to special needs services is depending on the choice of school, language required (English/French), area of specialization and degree of support needed, it may be very limited.
- Consult with CEM and school prior to any commitments.

CHILDCARE

Things to Consider:

Local childcare is available, no guarantee that staff will be English or French-speaking.

TRANSPORTATION

Things to Consider: Airport: Warsaw Chopin (WAW)

- You should carry an international driving permit.
- Penalties for driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs are severe.

Public Transport:

Public transportation throughout the city by bus and tram.

RESOURCES AND AMENITIES

Is there a Military Family Services centre available in that location?

No, under MFS(E) Riga & Remote.

Psychosocial / Mental Health Resources:

• Not at post, MFS(E) SW for dependants only, CAF SW/Mental Health Team for member and family are located in Geilenkirchen, Germany. Padre is located in Belgium.

Communications (e.g. Quality of Internet connection): Very good service & very reasonable prices.

ACTIVITIES

Access to sports or other leisure activities:

Plenty of recreational activities and venues available in this area for the whole family.

Availability of playgrounds: Yes, many.

Are common law relationships recognized? Yes

Are same sex couples recognized? Yes

Medications that are illegal in the country:

Use without a prescription of narcotic drugs or psychotropic substances is illegal. Cannabis is illegal.
